# Distance Learning at Parkville High School 2023-2024

#### Overview

In the upcoming 2023-2024 school year, Parkville High School will continue to offer the Distance Learning Program (DLP) for our students entering grades 10-12. This program allows students to take the classes required for graduation in a virtual setting. They will receive daily instruction from Parkville staff through Google Meets.

Students with an IEP requiring instruction Outside of General Education (OGE) will not be able to participate in this program as we cannot meet the level of services required by law. In addition, ESOL students in levels 1 & 2 will not be able to participate due to the language development needs. Magnet, GT and Honors courses will not be offered through the Distance Learning Program.

Students participating in DLP are in classes with other Parkville High School students and are eligible to participate in all extra-curricular activities including sports, dances and clubs.

Transportation is not offered to DLP students who choose to participate in extracurricular activities.

### **Course Offerings**

Course offerings in the Distance Learning Program for the 2023-2024 school year, are listed below. The menu of courses will allow students to meet the requirements for two possible Maryland State Completer Sequences: World Language completer (2 World Language credits & 2 Elective credits) or the College Career/Research Development Program (Intro to CRD, Advanced CRD, & Work Based Learning).

If needed, the student could be registered for a hybrid schedule, allowing in-person and distance learning on opposing days. For example, in-person on A-days and distance on B-days.

## **Requirements & Expectations for Participation in DLP**

Students interested in the Distance Learning Program must:

- 1. Attend online classes regularly and engage in class activities each day.
- 2. Be prepared and willing to appear on camera and/or use their microphone for certain lessons, as directed by their teacher(s).
- 3. Maintain a primary residence in Baltimore County where they are assigned to Parkville High School.
- 4. Parkville will continue to provide the BCPS issued device for students, however, you are responsible for assuring internet access.
- 5. Attend IN-PERSON testing administration, including State-Mandated assessments.
- 6. Commit to a full year of the DLP for the 2023-2024 school year. Requests to return to in-person learning can be made and will be reviewed by Parkville staff; however, once a student is withdrawn from the program, students may NOT re-enroll for any reason.

To apply for Parkville's Distance Learning Program for the 23-24 school year, you will need to:

- 1. Complete the online Registration Form.
- 2. After your request is received the School Counseling Department will work to determine if DLP would be a good fit for your student. The decision will be based on multiple factors including the classes being offered in the program and your student's individual educational needs.
- You will be notified by the end of April if your student has been cleared to participate in the program.
